• Faith: Belief, trust, or confidence in someone or something, sufficient that you act on it, in real life.

Reason + Faith = Partners facing uncertainty of reality



Philosophy of Postmodernism

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"It's alright if it feels right."

"You live your truth, I'll live my truth."

"That might be true ... for you."
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- 2. Affirms emotionalism and multiple relative truths.
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Philosophy of Postmodernism

Is this compatible with the claims made in the Bible?

- 1. Rejects rationalism and universal absolute truth.
- 2. Affirms emotionalism and multiple relative truths.
- 3. Absolute truth claims are dismissed as power plays.

"The human heart is deceitful above all things and is extremely sick. Who can understand it fully and know its secret motives?"

Jesus said, "For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, all sexual immorality, theft, lying, and slander. These are what defile a person ..."

In the beginning was the Word ... and the Word was God ... The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you really are my disciples.

Then you will know the *truth*, and the *truth* will set you free."

If Absolute Truth exists, then Postmodern Claims are false.



Truth is that which corresponds to Reality

- Exclusive: Truth excludes Falsehood (the not-real)
- Material Reality: Physical, Chemical, Biological
- Non-Material Reality: Psychological, Moral, Spiritual

Wholeness, Wellness, Peace, Shalom: when my heart, mind, soul, & strength all align together with Truth and Reality



Claim: "Absolute truth does not exist."

- Logically False: Postmodernism is self-refuting.
- Practically False: The "Cyanide" Test
 - Everyone, <u>everyone</u> (!), behaves as if reality & truth exist.
 - Physical, chemical, biological, psychological, moral reality.

Conclusion: Absolute truth exists.

Who gets to say which claims are true?



Claim: "The Bible is Wrong. I am Right."

Reply: "Says who?"



Who gets to say what is Right and Wrong?

- Each <u>Individual</u> gets to say what is Right and Wrong for themselves – <u>Independence View</u>
- 2. The <u>Strongest</u> gets to say what is Right and Wrong Evolutionary View
- 3. The Majority gets to say what is Right and Wrong Democratic-Cultural View

When would it be illegitimate to ask the formal intellectual equivalent of what is known in barrooms and schoolyards as the grand "Sez Who?" In the absence of God, each ethical and legal system will be differentiated by the answer it chooses to give to one key question:

Who among us *ought* to be able to declare law that *ought* to be obeyed?

Stated that baldly, the question is so intellectually unsettling that one would expect to find people trying NOT to come to grips with it ... if its avoidance was at all possible ...

Either God exists or He does not, but if He does not, nothing and no one else can take His place...

Who gets to say what is Right and Wrong?

Science to the Rescue?

"Right and Wrong are not objective independent unchanging Truths, they are just the product of evolution, convenient illusions of the mind to help us survive."

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Your illusions or mine? Is *all* knowledge a convenient illusion? Including evolution? Can you hold *anyone* accountable on this basis?

- Absolute Morality supersedes and is independent of:
- 1. Majority Opinion
- 2. The Will of the Strong
 - 3. Individual Opinion
- 4. Science, Society, Law

If none of these are the basis for Universal Morality ... and Universal Morality exists ...

... then WHO gets to say what is Right and Wrong?

Moral Argument for the Existence of God

- 1. If God does not exist, objective independent Morality cannot exist.
- 2. But, objective independent Morality does exist.
- 3. Therefore, God exists.

Who gets to say what is Right and Wrong?

God gets to choose ... ???

Truth is not an Abstract Concept.

Truth is a PERSON.

"I am the Truth ... Everyone on the side of Truth listens to me ... The Truth will set you free."

- Jesus

Real, reciprocal, self-sacrificial true agape love.

That Person does not *choose* what's Good, that Person *IS GOOD*.
